The Orchestra of the Southern Finger Lakes announces *MUSIC + LITERATURE: An OSFL Holiday Concert* on Saturday, December 7th at 4:00 PM at the Clemens Center Powers Theater in Elmira. Under the baton of Maestro Toshiyuki Shimada, now in his 10th season with the OSFL, the Orchestra will be joined by the Chorus of the Southern Finger Lakes and Dr. Matt Seybold, Professor at Elmira College, who will read selections from Mark Twain's Christmas letters and musings throughout the program. All ages are welcome.

The Elmira Trombone Choir, comprised of the OSFL trombone section and several other local trombonists, will kick off the festivities starting at 2:45 in the upper lobby. The OSFL's annual fundraiser gala, Afterglow, takes place immediately following the concert; interested individuals should contact the OSFL office by November 29 to attend the gala.

This concert will begin with the OSFL's own principal musicians, Susan Laib (principal oboe) and Augusto Diemecke (concertmaster) performing together as soloists in J.S. Bach's *Double Concerto*. The orchestra will also be performing the American premiere of *The White Messengers* by German composer, Fabian Joosten. The OSFL trumpet section will take center stage for *Bugler's Holiday* by Leroy Anderson.

The Chorus will be joined by guest soloist Ivy Walz (mezzo soprano) who will cover the alto solos in Vivaldi's *Gloria*, with soprano soloists from the chorus: Andrea Dietrich, Cari Stage, and Amanda Clark. The Chorus will also sing the very moving *Benedictus* from *The Armed Man*, a mass for peace by Welsh composer, Sir Karl Jenkins.

Other holiday staples will include Handel's *Hallelujah Chorus from the Messiah*, Robert Wendel's arrangement of *Chanukah Overture*, Anderson's *Sleigh Ride*, and of course the Christmas singalong medley. A family favorite, the tradition of an OSFL Holiday Concert is an afternoon packed full of a wide variety of music and holiday cheer.
