The Orchestra of the Southern Finger Lakes launches the '23-24 Musicians Choice Chamber Music Series with "Music Meets Art" with the Chrystallum Quartet, performing a mix of early music, classical, contemporary, and jazz. The concert is Friday, November 10<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 PM at North Presbyterian Church at 921 College Avenue in Elmira.

The quartet will be joined by artist Suyen Lau who will create a new piece of art on stage while the quartet performs. "The visual representation of the aural perception of music has always intrigued me," comments Karen Dusek, Managing Director of the Orchestra of the Southern Finger Lakes. "Some people are wired with strong associations between music and visual art. Suyen is gifted this way." An alum of the OSFL's Youth Orchestra, Suyen is currently studying fine arts and design at SUNY Corning Community College.

In addition to an early classical piece by Telemann, the musical compositions on the concert have some connection to the visual arts. *Brush Strokes* by composer Alyssa Morris is a musical depiction of specific works of art, with its 4 movements representing Monet, Seurat, Van Gogh, and Pollock. Another piece, composed by Nicole Chamberlain, is set to the silent film *LeCharmeur*.

Following the tradition of the Musicians' Choice Chamber Music Series, oral program notes will be given by the musicians interspersed throughout the performance. The short format program (60 to 75 minutes) is presented in an intimate, relaxed setting without intermission. Doors open at 6:45. Come early to view Suyen Lau's artwork on display.
